Concerns could be identified in individuals across the spectrum of care and with diverse ages and presentation.

A feeding, eating, swallowing clinician is a health care professional with training or experience in feeding difficulties and will often be involved in helping infants and children overcome a variety of feeding and/or swallowing concerns. They may work with families individually, but more often work as part of a team.

Intake could happen in different ways – in some areas this is a telephone screen, in others it is a review of the referral or an inperson screening visit. Intake can also occur in tandem with assessment. The alternative services helpful to FES clinicians are as diverse as our clients. A clinician may recommend referrals to specialty physician resources (ie gastroenterology, cleft clinics, etc) or alternate allied health supports not previously accessed.
