Transforming Clinical Practice

PEAS has started working with clinicians and families across Alberta to transform care and put into practice the tools and information available on the <u>PEAS website</u>.

Using the Innovation Learning Collaborative (ILC) methodology, 14 AHS teams are targeting improvements including:

- Reducing wait times and hospitalizations
- Ensuring every patient has a <u>care plan</u> and is involved in shared decision making
- Implementing the Clinical Practice Guide
- Communicating with primary and community care
- Establishing a <u>Team Charter</u> to clarify goals and team roles and responsibilities

Over the next 18 months, teams across Alberta will track their progress, share ideas and implement quality improvement plans through a series of ILC workshops.
